MONDAY: Psalm 30:11

You turned my wailing into dancing; you removed my sackcloth and clothed me with joy,

TUESDAY: Matthew 6:33

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

WEDNESDAY: Revelation 21:5a

He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!"

THURSDAY: Romans 5:3-5
