

Before the resurrected Jesus ascended to heaven, he told his disciples his plan for them. "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) In other words, Jesus was telling them, "You'll proclaim the good news of the kingdom everywhere: in your hometowns, in your neighboring communities, and in places on the other side of the world."

Earlier this year, our church council put together a Missions Task Force to think strategically about how Goochland Baptist participates in God's mission to proclaim the good news of God's kingdom. Aside from our ongoing support of St. Matthews Food Pantry and the Brown Bag Lunches for Goochland Elementary School, we wanted to concentrate our efforts on critical mission opportunities around us. This verse came to the forefront of our conversations and has guided our plans for mission this year. You'll have opportunities to participate in mission here, in our neighboring communities, and around the world.

Starting this month, we'll focus on where we worship: our church. Vacation Bible School is one of our greatest outreaches to our neighborhood each year, and we've already got a good group of children signed up for VBS (July 16-20). But to make it work, we need your help! We still need volunteers to do everything from teaching, to helping in the kitchen, to leading stations. In

addition, we have a list of supplies needed to help turn our church into Rolling River Rampage Adventure camp for children. You can find a full list of supplies needed under "Mission Opportunities" on page 5 of this newsletter. Please take a look around your house to see if you have anything we can borrow! Your help will enhance our witness to local children and families, as we teach about a God who goes with us as we "pass through the waters" of life.

In July and August, we'll focus on serving our surrounding community. Gale Chaisson has talked with local schools and discovered that while the elementary schools receive backpacks and supplies from local churches, Goochland Middle School doesn't receive any of that. To help our middle-schoolers in our community, we'll focus our efforts after Bible School on collecting backpacks and school supplies for our neighbors at Goochland Middle School.

This fall, we'll turn our attention to the "uttermost ends of the earth" through Operation Christmas Child. We have a number of boxes to fill, and we'll invite church members to help fill these boxes and send them to children across the globe.

Our witness will be strengthened when we all pitch in where we can. I hope that you'll participate in Goochland Baptist's efforts to be witness "in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the uttermost ends of the earth."

The World I Grew Up In Is No More

I am a child of the 50's. The world I grew up in is no more. On Saturday mornings, after a quick bowl of mortar thick Cream of Wheat, Mom turned us out into the world. We descended into the ravine to muck around in the creek, catching crawfish behind their claws and, if we were lucky, using them to terrorize neighborhood girls. Little boy genes sucked us into the most pugnacious of endeavors like "king of the mountain" and tackle football, free of the nuisance of prissy protective padding. As if by coincidence, our bellies would announce the lunch hour and we would blow into the house for a quick baloney sandwich and a fist full of butter cookies. And then, it was off to rejoin the battle. It would be pitch black and supper time before we trundled ourselves home, ravenous and spent. On Halloween night, pillow cases in hand, we would plunder the neighborhood, vying to see which of us could amass the most exorbitant pile of cheap candy. When we noticed porch lights snuffed out, we knew it was time to head home. I never recall any indication that our neighborhood was anything other than the bucolic wonderland that I have certainly romanticized. There was, it seemed, nothing to fear. Yes, the world I grew up in is no more. Today, it seems, we dare not allow a child to wait for the school bus without adult supervision. Prime time TV celebrates abhorrent values. School shootings seem to occur on a weekly basis. An unfiltered internet, offers endless portals into the darkest catacombs of the human heart.

Obviously, I am not an authority on parenting. But when I consider the vast disparity between the world I grew up in and the world of today, I am tempted to despair. How do you raise healthy and morally grounded children in such a world? I am grateful that my despair, these days, gives way to hope. In my years at Goochland Church, I have watched as so many of our families have sent out into this world some of the finest young adults I have encountered. In spite of the "darkness" that would so easily steal them away, these families have raised kids who demonstrate discipline, sound judgement, wisdom, and openness to the "still small voice" of God. There is no substitute for "fleshing out" in real life the spiritual values we proclaim and these parents have done just that. I commend them. As a church, we have invested much time, effort, and resources in seeking to support and complement their efforts. I commend you. It may or may not "take a village" to raise a child but I am grateful that we all can have, at least, a small part in this most holy enterprise.
